During April 2020, LEAPS was dispatched 277 times totaling 30.2 hours providing airborne tactical and strategic surveillance for 193.4 hours. LEAPS provided real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding incorporated and unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Highlights from this month, include the following:

LEAPS provided early surveillance for a major fire reported at the Lancaster Village Senior Apartments. LEAPS was able to see a major fire erupting on the third floor of the building, and notified Los Angeles County Fire Department (LACFD) that a second and third alarm was needed. This allowed the LACFD to respond with enough resources to prevent loss of life.

LEAPS responded rapidly to a domestic disturbance / possible kidnapping call in the 45000 block of Coventry Court, where a female victim was reportedly thrown into a car.

LEAPS responded to a call for multiple males fighting in the 43300 block of 7th Street East. Using its IR sensor, LEAPS provided surveillance for ground units and five (5) arrests were made.

LEAPS provided real-time tactical surveillance for a deputy involved in a fight call near Sierra Highway & Avenue I.

LEAPS provided surveillance for a felony stop of a stolen vehicle in the area of 10th Street West & Avenue I where two (2) arrests were made.

During the month, LEAPS responded to several attempted suicide calls, including one in the vicinity of Beech & Avenue J-4, for a female who allegedly cut her wrist with a knife.

At Mariposa Park, two (2) juveniles broke into a building. LEAPS provided imagery leading to the arrest of both suspects.
