(LEAPS)

PROVIDES AERIAL TACTICAL AND STRATEGIC RECONNAISSANCE FOR THE CITY OF LANCASTER AND THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT During June 2020, LEAPS was dispatched 253 times totaling 42.9 hours providing airborne tactical and strategic surveillance. LEAPS provided real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding incorporated and unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Highlights from this month, include the following:

LEAPS provided 26.1 hours of tactical support for the Lancaster and Palmdale LASD stations covering peaceful demonstrations at several sites across the Antelope Valley. LEAPS Provided demonstration support at several locations, including Lancaster City Hall, Lancaster Blvd, Sgt. Steve Owen Memorial Park, Avenue K & 5th Street East, LASD Lancaster Station, Supervisor Barger's office, Avenue L & 30th Street West, Quartz Hill High School, Avenue L-8 & 50th Street West, LASD Palmdale Station, Palmdale City Hall, Avenue S & 25th Street East, Avenue P & 30th Street West, Avenue O & 10th Street West, Sierra Highway & Palmdale Blvd. among others.

LEAPS provided real-time tactical surveillance video of the demonstrations to the Lancaster Emergency Operations / Emergency Resource Center located in Lancaster City Hall. LEAPS also provided live video to personnel at the LASD Palmdale station.

Providing support for a Lancaster vehicle burglary in progress in the 43800 block of Division Street, LEAPS was able to follow the running suspect over fences and through business lots directing units to the suspect's location where the arrest occurred.

LEAPS responded rapidly to a trailer park at 185th Street West and Avenue D for a possible mentally disturbed person. One person was arrested.

While assisting with a "person with a gun" call in Lake Los Angeles LEAPS provided aerial surveillance and directed arriving units to the remote desert scene. The suspect was located and detained without incident. Real-time video at the Lancaster Station dispatch was monitored by the watch sergeant and watch commander.

LEAPS provided surveillance of an attempted carjacking at 15th Street West & Avenue K.

LEAPS used IR imagery to check for curfew violations at locations around the city, including parks, city hall and Lancaster Blvd.
