During January 2022, LEAPS was airborne 48.7 hours and dispatched 94 times for 12.3 hours of airborne tactical support and 36.4 hours of strategic surveillance with real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Dispatch results for this month fall into distinct categories summarized to the right on this page. Dispatches from the Lancaster LASD station covered an area generally defined by Avenue A to the North, 90th on the East, Avenue S on the South and 90th to the West; encompassing 288 square miles. Some specific events during windy conditions include the following:

This month's dispatches saw LEAPS support Deputies for an assault with a deadly weapon traffic stop. LEAPS maintained an aerial view of the situation for the Deputies and captured video of their resulting detention.



LEAPS was dispatched to the location of a reported person down on the street in need of medical assistance call and remained on station until assistance arrived and the individual was taken care of by Los Angeles Fire.

Responding to a dispatch from a father of a car stolen by his daughter at 90th Street East, LEAPS located the vehicle, tracked its progress, directed Deputies to the vehicle's route, and remained on station while they accomplished a traffic stop bringing the situation under control.
