During February 2022, LEAPS was airborne 56.0 hours and dispatched 94 times for 12.7 hours of airborne tactical support and 43.3 hours of strategic surveillance with real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Dispatch results for this month fall into distinct categories summarized to the right on this page. Dispatches from the Lancaster LASD station covered an area generally defined by **Avenue F** to the North, **160th Street** on the East, **Avenue V** on the South and **75th Street** to the West; encompassing over **411** square miles. Some specific events during windy and intermittent precipitation conditions include the following:

This month's dispatches saw LEAPS support Deputies for a robbery felony traffic stop. LEAPS maintained an aerial view of the situation for the Deputies capturing video of their resulting detention.



LEAPS in response to a dispatch, arrived at the location of a multi vehicle collision with one on fire. LEAPS remained on station until Deputies and first responders arrived and the situation was brought under control.

Responding to a dispatch concerning a fire at a homeless encampment, LEAPS located the transient motorhome fire and remained on station until Deputies and LA fire brought the situation under control.



In supporting the AV Homeless Census takers effort this month, LEAPS identified 47 different homeless encampments across the Antelope Valley.

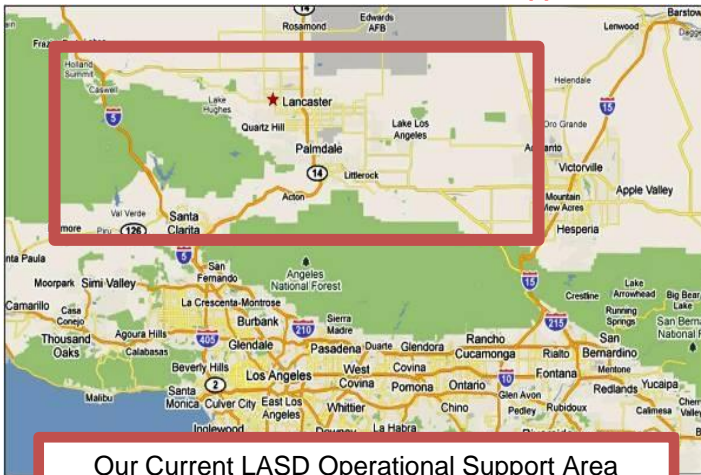
