During September 2022, LEAPS was airborne 87.4 hours and dispatched 211 times for 32.8 hours of airborne tactical support and 54.6 hours of strategic surveillance with real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Dispatch results for September fall into distinct categories summarized to the right on this page. Dispatches from the Lancaster LASD station covered an area generally defined by Avenue E to the North, 170th Street on the East, Avenue O on the South and 90th Street to the West; encompassing over 260 square miles. Some specific events during windy and intermittent precipitation conditions include the following:

September's dispatches had LEAPS respond to a call reporting a fire hydrant being hit by a car at 30th East and Avenue I with it leaving the scene. Arriving first, the vehicle was seen departing the impact area. LEAPS found and followed the vehicle, directed the reporting Deputies to the location of the vehicle where they detained the driver.



LEAPS arrived first and provided aerial coverage for Deputies responding to a Driving Under the Influence roll over on Avenue F East.



LEAPS was dispatched to a call responding to a semi trailer tuck colliding into a house in Lake Los Angeles at 170th East. The livestock in the trailer was killed and the house seriously damaged. LEAPS circled and provided video coverage for the incident.

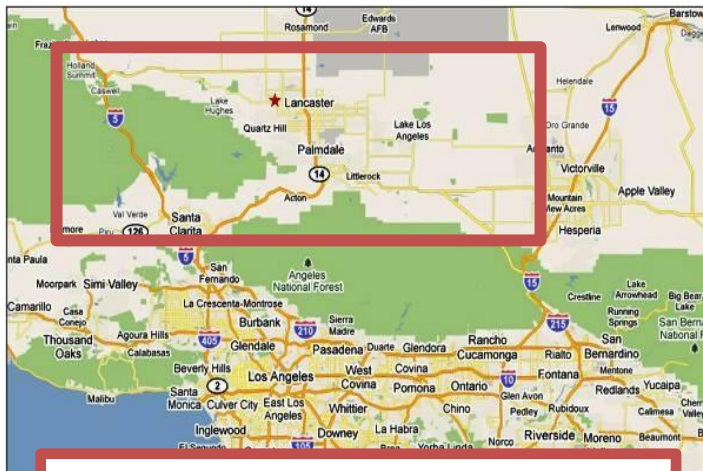
